


Mission Letter

A year not quite as the others

December 2020



The year 2020 will go down in history as the year of the great pandemic of Covid-19, the sneaky little virus that turned our lives upside down and made everything never be the same again. A first and then a second wave reminded us of our fragility and our apparent powerlessness to protect ourselves from it. It is true: we are not completely in control of our destiny. We are only creatures even though we are beloved daughters and sons of God.

However, we took the opportunity to learn many things about the meaning of life, about death, about God. We have understood, at least 1 hope, how important it is to show solidarity, our behavior having a positive or negative influence on others. May this New Year remind us that we must avoid returning to the abuses of a consumer society culture and the search for power! May we live better, humanize ourselves more and humanize our environment, without forgetting the people who live in very difficult situations in other countries!

Your spiritual and financial assistance has enabled our “confreres” in Africa to continue to meet the very concrete needs of the people they serve.
