
Mission Letter

Dear friends and benefactors,

Father Marc Angers has now joined our community in Montreal. After missionary service in Tanzania and South Africa he has served for 18 years in Toronto. He has edited this letter for many years and has made mission appeals in many parishes in Toronto and Hamilton dioceses. He has served on the Distribution Committee of the Pastoral Mission Fund in the Archdiocese of Toronto. He has supplied in several parishes (both English & French speaking) and especially in St. Jerome parish in Brampton. He has been involved with the Cursillio movement and has been the diocesan coordinator for the French sector.



For him, this is not yet retirement, he remains available for ministry services.



Father **Marcel Boivin** died earlier this year in Quebec City. He has served for many years in the Archdiocese of Toronto especially in Annunciation Parish on Don Mills, in St Edwards, and Sainte Famille in Mississauga.

He has served in five different countries in Africa, namely Malawi, Kenya, Angola, South Africa and Zambia. He also worked in Assumption and Sacré-Coeur parishes, especially with the African Catholic Community. He then served another 10 years in Africa. Provincial community as community coordinator. He is glad to return to Toronto where he has many friends and acquaintances.
